



## Youth Delinquency Prevention Strategies through Character Education Programs

In contrast, adolescents who come from

families that give less attention, or do not receive spiritual support from the church, are more susceptible to the negative influences of the social environment.

6. Adolescent delinquency prevention strategies must be holistic and sustainable, where character education is not only part of the formal education system, but is also built into daily life through habits, service, and reflection of faith. In this study, it was found that approaches that link academic education, spiritual coaching, family support, and church community involvement have a more significant impact on reducing the tendency for deviant behavior in adolescents.
